## No School for Students Next Monday, October 18 for Teacher PD

### Health Screening Forms Need to be Completed by 7:30 a.m. Daily

Dear All Saints Catholic School Parents,

Last Friday we notified families that we would begin utilizing the daily morning screeners for students. All parents should have received their first screener email and text this morning. We truly appreciate families taking the time to complete these screeners and remaining vigilant to ensure un-well children are staying home from school.

As we move into the cold and flu season, we are starting to see more students with symptoms. We are also beginning to have families with positive COVID cases in their households and subsequently need to quarantine students in various grades. This week we needed to move our 6th graders to virtual learning in order to mitigate potential COVID spread and additional quarantines.

With that being said, our main goal is to provide a safe in-person school year and limit quarantines. Parents continuing to remain vigilant when students are experiencing symptoms, and keeping students home when they are sick, is vital to our success. We ask all families to please do the following:

\*Watch for any potential COVID symptoms: fever of 100.4 degrees F or higher; chills; sore throat; cough; shortness of breath; difficulty breathing; fatigue; muscle or body aches; headache; new loss of taste or smell; congestion or runny nose; nausea or vomiting; and diarrhea.

\*If your student or a member of your household is showing symptoms, please get tested and limit your family's exposure to other families until receiving a negative result. Please do not send your student to school if they have possible COVID symptoms or if you are awaiting COVID test results.

\*If your child is home quarantining, please do not participate in afterschool activities (e.g., sports and playdates with other families).

We will continue to notify homeroom classes or grade levels 4th to 8th grade if there is a positive case within that class/grade.

Please submit the registration form by Monday, October 18, 2021. Most clubs will begin in November, unless otherwise noted. Please complete one form for each child. Thank you.


## Scholastic Book Fair Is Coming In-Person October 25-29
