Mrs. Pisarski to Start Daily Prayer

One of the greatest gifts we have each day is the opportunity to join in morning prayer with our kids. Beginning today, Mrs. Pisarski will be sending staff and families a morning prayer to start the day. We encourage you to continue this valuable daily practice to lift our community up in prayer.

Families in Prayer (Formerly Parents in Prayer)

Over the past year, our students have written heartfelt intentions every week to be prayed for by parents in our community. We want to keep this beautiful devotion going during this critical time for our nation and world. What a great blessing for us to be able to bring this practice into our homes and to pray with our families. Below is a description of the prayer process:

1. Write prayer intentions

During the week, have all family members write their prayer intentions. They may write as many as they desire, with a minimum of at least one prayer submitted by each person.

2. Place intentions in a prayer basket

Place petitions in the basket as they are written throughout the week

3. Prior to praying the rosary

Set up a table with an image of Mary, a crucifix, and/or a candle

Read and share the petitions

Place the basket on the prayer table

4. Pray the rosary together as a family

Set a specific time and day to pray together, for example during school we prayed from 8:10-8:35 a.m. on Fridays. Setting a time helps us to fulfill our commitment.

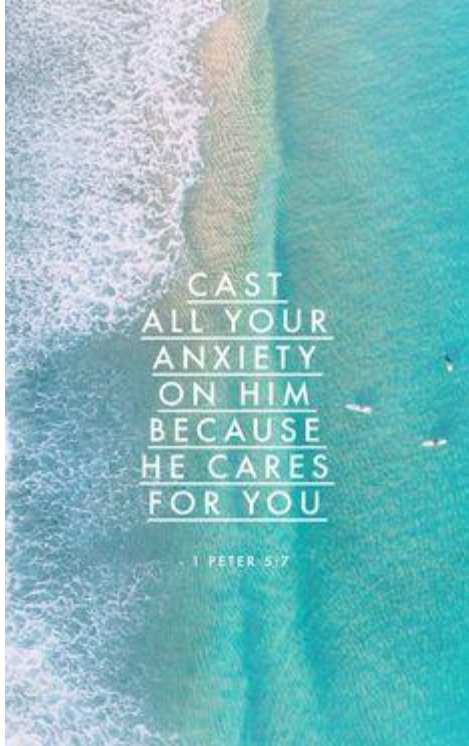

Sample Suggested Schedule for Families

Some parents have asked us for suggestions on the way to structure distance learning for their children. Here is a sample schedule. Please note that this exact structure is NOT a requirement. This is only a guide for those seeking a starting point as we begin this new adventure in learning together.

Before 9:00 a.m.	Wake Up!	Make your bed, eat breakfast, brush teeth, get dressed, say morning prayers
9:00-11:00 a.m.	Academic Time	Distance learning, watch videos, do day’s assignments for language arts, math, science, social studies, and religion.
11:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m.	Creative Time/Outdoor Time	Creative play, drawing, Legos, crafts, music, cooking, baking, outdoor play, do some enrichment activities from Specials teachers
12:00-12:30 p.m.	Lunch	
12:30 – 1:00 p.m.	Home Chores	Clean rooms, put away toys, take out the garbage, pet care
1:00-2:00 p.m.	Quiet Time	Reading, nap, puzzles
2:00-3:30 p.m.	Academic Time	Distance learning, watch videos, do day’s assignments for language arts, math, science, social studies, and religion.
3:30-5:00 p.m.	Outdoor Time	Family walk, outdoor play
5:00-6:00 p.m.	Dinner
