



This year’s theme is Arctic Adventures. We’re looking forward to sharing the blizzard of new books that we will have for sale!




Classroom Happenings



Professor Map appeared in 4th grade social studies classes last week to help explain latitude, longitude, measurement, and other map skills. The students exuberantly welcomed Professor Map--AKA Mr. Arnould--and were excited to receive their own state maps so they could learn the lessons.



Mrs. Railling's kindergarten class worked on a STEM project on Friday. Using toothpicks, mini marshmallows, and pieces of foam, the students constructed a shelter for an animal.

6th Graders Enjoy Camping Trip





PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT AND WAIVER

I understand that my child’s participation in the Program is voluntary and that as I condition of my child’s participation, I agree to comply with all Program requirements including, but not limited to: (a) accurately completing all registration forms in a timely manner, (b) ensuring that my child is aware of the Program’s standards of conduct; (c) and immediately notifying the Program Administrator of any concerns related to the health, safety or security of my child, other participants, or Program staff.
